"Tasted at the château with Nicolas Thienpont, this displays a dark and hugely concentrated nose, a melange of creamed black plum and black cherry liqueur, with nuances of white flower petals, toast and vanilla, with a bright, pure and very expressive style. The palate follows on from this beginning in a very true style, broad and textured, weighty, nevertheless with a very fresh and bright character. It is dense, sinewy and textured towards the finish, with a huge seam of tightly knit tannins running through the core of the wine, giving the palate a massive grip, but the substance of the fruit, all dark and savoury, copes with this remarkably well. This is a real tour de force, certainly substantial, and loaded with potential, with a future that I can see stretching out for many decades. So long and tannic in the finish. Excellent."

“The 2016 Pavie Macquin, matured in 50% new oak, has a rich, opulent bouquet that doles out layers of black cherry and boysenberry fruit, then finds more refinement and draws everything back once you’ve been seduced. The palate is medium-bodied with grainy tannin, grippy in the mouth, with a masculine, minerally finish and a saline aftertaste. Comparing two bottles, one at the London UGC and one at the château, I found that the latter displayed more detail and nuance. 14.5% alcohol.”

“Deep garnet-purple in color, the 2016 Pavie Macquin charges out of the glass with gregarious black cherries, warm blackberries and wild blueberries scents followed up by loads of red roses, baking spices, cedar chest and unsmoked cigars sparks plus a waft of wild thyme. Medium to full-bodied, the palate is an exercise in poise, revealing layer upon layer of cherries and berries flavors and tons of savory nuances, framed by firm yet exquisitely ripe tannins, finishing very long.”

“The nose is elegant, concentrated and finely powerful. It reveals notes of blackberry, crushed cassis and small notes of raspberry, wild strawberry combined with fine touches of cherry as well as discreet hints of spice. Sichuan pepper, cardamom and an imperceptible hint of violet (in the background). The palate is fruity, well-balanced racy and offers a beautiful juiciness, power, a beautiful mineral frame, a very fine suavity as well as a beautiful and slightly tight grain. On the palate this wine expresses notes of fresh/crunchy cassis, plum and small notes of wild raspberry associated with small touches of redcurrants, fresh cherry as well as discreet hints of zan, tonka bean and toasted/spices. Tannins are fine and elegant. There are discreet hints of dried almond on the finish (bring gourmandise). Good length. A beautiful wine!”

“You have to like your grapes poured over a rock quarry to get this wine, but I love it. The color of Homer’s wine dark sea with levels of extract that coat your palate, teeth and gums. There is something special here you can easily sense, with crushed velvet textures and the perfect combination of decadence and refined elegance. Even though this is incredibly powerful, everything is in harmony. The pure fruits linger, build and expand; this is a unique textural experience. The wine was produced from blending 82% Merlot, 16% Cabernet Franc and 2% Cabernet Sauvignon. The Merlot was harvested October 7 to October 21, the Cabernet Franc, October 17 to October 20 and the Cabernet Sauvignon on October 20. The wine reached 14.4% alcohol with a pH of 3.35.”

"Tasted with Nicolas Thienpont and David Suire at the estate, for the second year running this vineyard has put in a stellar performance. The sample presented was a finished blend featuring 82% Merlot, picked October 7th, 13th, 15th, 17th, 19th, 20th and 21st, 16% Cabernet Franc, picked October 17th, 19th and 20th, and just 2% Cabernet Sauvignon, picked October 20th. The crop was 46 hl/ha from 12.5 hectares of vines in production. Analyses have given us the wine's vital statistics as 14.2% alcohol and pH 3.35. A much more creamed style to the fruit on the nose than Larcis Ducasse, tasted alongside, with perfumed essence of black cherry, very pure and defined, with a little dark currant intensity. The palate is fresh, pure, with rich dark fruits, substantial, with a gently polished weight as well as a beautifully ripe tannic backbone. This has everything, purity, an elegant but confident texture, freshness and lift, with a well-hidden tannic grip. Delicious, and it surely has super potential. This makes two great vintages in a row for Pavie-Macquin."

It reveals notes of fresh blackberry, flowers (violet, hint of iris), black cherry and a discreet touch of racy minerality (limestone/terroir) associated with slight hints of toasted oak, a very discreet hint of pepper as well as an imperceptible hint of coffee and spices. The palate is fruity, juicy, beautifully delicate/silky, precise, slightly tight, full of elegance and offers a beautiful definition, a slight tension, precision, gourmandise as well as a nice "guideline". In the mouth this wine expresses notes of fresh/ripe blackberry, fresh/ripe strawberry and hints of cassis associated with slight notes of chocolate, oak and sweet spices. Tannins are fine, ripe and wellbuilt. Good length and good persistence. A beautiful wine!"
